Our Mission: Embrace and reassure Survivors that they are continually linked to the Army Family through a unified support program that enables them to remain an important part of the Army for as long as they desire.

The Survivor Outreach Services (SOS) program is an Army-wide program which demonstrates the Army's commitment to Families of the Fallen. SOS is a holistic and multi-agency approach to delivery services to survivors by providing services at garrisons and communities closest to where the Families live.



What does the SOS Program do?

- Serves the Families of all Army components within the State of Oregon: National Guard, Reserves and Active Duty
- Provides information on the benefits and entitlements available to military Families
- Coordinates support groups
- Performs as an advocate on behalf of Survivors
- Provides budgeting/financial management resources
- Serves all military Families regardless of training status: M-day, Veteran and Retired
- Provides life skills education resources
- Ensures access to all entitled benefits for Families
- Provides mental health counseling resources
- Provides estate planning resources
- Functions as long term support for Survivors
